## SESSION 5 FOLLOW-UP & ACTION ITEMS

## **SESSION 5 SUMMARY:**

In session 5, you reported out on the top five character traits and top five competency traits of the kinds of disciples you are seeking to develop in your context. We moved from that significant "thinking step" to begin crafting your description of the Dream Disciple that your local community desperately needs more of.

Your Dream Disciple description consists of four roles you want to help people grow into so that they can embody the mission of your church in everyday places of life.

## **SESSION 5 ACTION TIMES:**

☐ Dream Disciple Development

As a team, work to craft your description of a Dream Disciple. Remember, it's the picture of a mature, reproducing disciple of Jesus. Be sure to include the following:

- Four Roles: Title each role with one word or two words. (See examples on top of p. 3-10)
- **Definition:** A one-sentence definition for each role to assure there is duplication or confusion in what you mean by each role.
- **Two Discipling questions:** For each role, craft two disciplining questions that are orienting, dynamic, and catalytic. (See p. 3-7 if you need to be reminded of what we mean by those three filters. And, you'll find examples of questions on p 3-10.)
